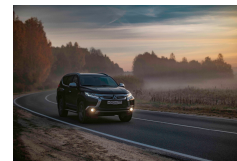
We at United Way prefer to call it an “investment” - an investment in our community at a price that will not put a dent in a person’s wallet. Here is how we can put that dollar to good use.

**\$3.00 a week will provide 6 meals for a family in need**



**\$5.00 a week provides a week of before and after school childcare for 3 children.**

**\$6.00 a day provides 1 shelter family transportation for a year**



**\$30.00 a week will help an at-risk family find reliable childcare**
